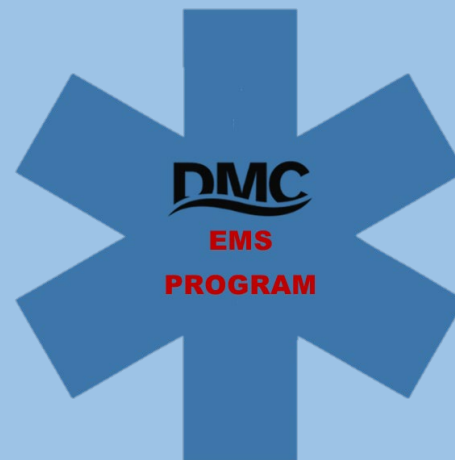

# SPEAKER BIOS

- Wayne Tisdale – Wayne T. Tisdale’s education is a Master of Public Administration, Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi, December 1999. A Master of Arts, (Criminal Justice Focus), Corpus Christi State University, May 1990. A Bachelor of Arts-Criminal Justice, University of Texas at San Antonio, December 1983. An Associate of General Study, Broward Community College, May 1980. A Graduate Diploma, Command and General Staff College, Ft Leavenworth, USA. March 2002. Wayne’s law enforcement experience started as a Military Police Officer, a Deputy Sheriff and Deputy Constable. He retired as a Captain from the Corpus Christi Police Department and has thirty four years as a commissioned peace officer with the State of Texas. He currently holds certification levels of Master Peace Officer and Basic Jailer. Other Texas licenses are: Instructor, (FBI Course), Firearms Instructor and Mental Health Peace Officer. His professional teaching experience is over twenty five years at Del Mar College and at Texas A&M University-CC. The education programs were in academia and academy settings. Wayne taught in-service classes throughout his career and commanded the Corpus Christi Police Academy. He continues to teach throughout the state in Crisis Intervention courses.
