

Regional EMS Time Out Report

M	Age/Sex, Mechanism or Medical Complaint	Age, Sex (include patient's name for handover), Mechanism of Injury or Medical Complaint/History
Ι	Injuries or Inspections	Time of Injury, list injuries head to toe; or Inspections (time of onset, brief medical exam/findings)
S	Vital Signs	Vital signs: first set and significant changes; include glucose.
Т	Treatment	Treatment

Give EMS 30 seconds, we'll tell you everything you need to know!

Receiving Nurse will call "EMS Time Out" when EMS arrives with patient.

Trauma Alert, Heart Alert, & Stroke Alert Patients will remain on the stretcher during report ('Non-Alert')

Patients may be moved to the gurney if the nurse is not present to receive report).

EMS has 30 seconds to provide report.

Nurse will document report on Regional EMS Time Out Report form.

Patient will be moved to the gurney.

Nurse provides registration sticker to EMS.

Patient Transfer of Care (TOC) completed.
